All of the trees listed occur within the development zone and will be removed for the proposed project. Trunk diameters were measured at 4.5 feet above ground (Diameter at Breast Height, or DBH). For multi-trunk trees, an equivalent trunk diameter was calculated from the sum of the cross section areas of each stem (or the largest six stems).

* Identification of *Ficus* species can be determined when fruit ripens in late summer. *Ficus macrophylla* (Moreton Bay Fig) has reddish- brown to purple figs with paler spots, 1 inch in diameter. *Ficus rubigosa* (Rustyleaf Fig) has yellow figs, 1/2 inch in diameter.
