

EXHIBIT AREA PART OF BUILDING ADDITION

Construction of a new addition to the Lytton Savings and Loan Assn. building at 2150 Sunset Blvd. to accommodate expanding business operations and to provide space for a permanent exhibit area was announced yesterday by Bart Lytton, president of the association.

The new 16,000-sq.-ft. building represents the second phase in the master plan development of the 2½-acre former Garden of Allah site at east end of Sunset Strip. It will be located at the lower level of the property adjoining the main structure on the south side.

The exhibit area of the building, which is to be known as Lytton Center Pavilion, will contain 9,000 sq. ft. of floor space. This will include a 200-seat auditorium, an area for the display of the Lytton collection of pre-cinema artifacts and an area for showing educational and art exhibits.

Huge Mural

An attractive feature of the reinforced concrete structure will be a huge 10 ft. x 90 ft. mural in the entrance lobby.

The new building has been designed by Kurt Meyer, AIA, a member of the architectural firm of Haggman & Meyer. Interiors are by Adele Faulkner, AID. William Simpson Construction Co. is the general contractor.

When completed, the auditorium will be a multi-purpose assembly area with partially fixed and partially movable seating. A motion picture projection booth is being installed.

Also provided will be facilities for lectures and small dramatic presentations. The area also will be

used as a training center for Lytton employees.

Parking for 150 cars will be provided on a landscaped roof. A section of this area is being designed so that it may be used for large outdoor assemblies through the installation of temporary bleacher seating.
