Because it is possible that no soil contamination could exist at the Development Project Site, Mitigation Measure G.1 in the Draft EIR has been edited as follows:

Section I (Introduction/Summary), Page I-24, Table I-1

- G-1. If contamination is discovered at the Development Project site, ~~P~~prior to issuance of a building permit, the applicant shall obtain a “No Further Action” letter from the LACFD that verifies that all identified contaminants have been remediated to below the Maximum Concentration Levels (MCL) appropriate for residential use. The Project Applicant shall also receive verification from the LACFD that all soil to be exported offsite is remediated to the appropriate levels for export.

Section IV.G (Hazards and Hazardous Materials), Page IV.G-30

- G-1.
