J. POPULATION

Determined not significant by the Los Angeles City Planning Department October 4, 1984 Initial Study. The Planning Department determined in the January 22, 1999 Initial Study that the project may result in a change in the distribution, density or growth rate of the human population of the area. The Proposed Project would result in the addition of 308 new residents and 896 new employees¹ at the site. This would not result in a significant population impact in the area.
